Dear Majority Leader McConnell, Speaker Pelosi, Minority Leader Schumer, Minority Leader McCarthy, Chairman Barrasso, Ranking Member Carper, Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, Chairman Murkowski, Ranking Member Manchin, Chairwoman Johnson and Ranking Member Lucas:

On behalf of the Carbon Capture Coalition's over 80 energy, industrial and technology companies, energy and industrial labor unions, and conservation, environmental and clean energy NGOs, we write to request that you act now to negotiate and enact a bipartisan legislative package of bold research, development and demonstration (RD&D) measures for

carbon capture, removal, use and storage. As a starting point, we urge you to leverage the passage of the Clean Energy Jobs and Innovation Act (H.R. 4447) and the USE IT Act (S. 383) in the House and Senate, respectively, and the progress made in resolving disagreements holding up the American Energy Innovation Act (AEIA, S. 2657) in the Senate.

In September, the House passed the Clean Energy Jobs and Innovation Act. The bipartisan provisions in Title III of the Act represent the most far-reaching demonstration and commercialization policies for carbon capture, removal, use and storage to have ever passed a chamber of Congress. In the Senate, the AEIA represents the culmination of more than 50 bipartisan bills, several of which would also collectively advance a comprehensive and consequential RD&D agenda for carbon capture. And the bipartisan USE IT Act, passed as an amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act, contains additional provisions for direct air capture and carbon utilization.

Taken together, the many important provisions contained in these three bills and supported by both parties would, if integrated into one package and enacted yet this year, provide the next critical step in building a broader federal policy portfolio to achieve economywide deployment of carbon capture. This would represent a signature accomplishment of the 116th Congress and build on the landmark bipartisan reform and expansion of 45Q achieved with the passage of the FUTURE Act in 2018.

The results of our national election underscore the continued need for bipartisan solutions to our climate and energy challenges. We urge you to continue working to resolve whatever differences in these bills that remain. Accomplishing this important unfinished business in the current year-end session of Congress would send an important and needed signal that America can make progress on vital commonsense legislation supported by both political parties.

Thank you for your consideration of our request. We stand ready to provide any additional information you might require.
